Learning the fretboard opens up a new world of possibilities. Piano keyboard layout: there is only 1 path, 1 option for playing the C major scale from C lowest to C one octave (7 white frets) higher For example, suppose you want to play a C major scale that starts from the 3rd frets of the fifth string (A string).

## **Guitar Notes | How To Learn The Fretboard**

The main reason is because the guitar is so visual that a player can learn everything by patterns and shapes. Patterns and shapes do work to get people playing, but where learners have problems is when they are trying to move patterns to different parts of the neck, change key, transpose and re-finger chords or scales.

## **How to Memorize the Notes on the Guitar Neck**

Guitar notes on the fretboard in open position are shown on the diagram below: Guitar Notes In Open Position. The diagram above shows guitar notes in open or first position. This is the position of your fretting hand when playing open strings and notes in the first four frets.

FIGURE 6. LEARN YOUR OCTAVES One way to facilitate fretboard memorization is to find all the places on the neck where you can play a specific pitch. FIGURE 7 is a group of frames that show various places on the neck where you can find the note G and its octaves.

## **Master the guitar fretboard | Learn every note fast.**

Step 3: Read the rest of the fretboard with three simple patterns. Instead of busting your tail working out the half steps and whole steps on each string, you can use a couple simple patterns to figure out everything else. Start from a (just as an example) on your 6th string. Now go up two strings and up two frets.

Step 1: Root Patterns. So no matter which fret/string you start on, once you've learned these patterns you'll know where the same note exists near by on other strings. As you learn chords and scales, these root patterns will help you to identify where a particular note exists throughout the pattern or shape.
